Andi Hoffmann & B-Goes come to Nightfall

Andi Hoffmann was born and raised in Switzerland and currently lives in New Orleans.

The vocalist/guitarist is influenced by both cultures, as well as a wide variety of other musical styles in his writings. The music he makes as part of Andi Hoffmann & B-Goes includes Cajun, calypso, reggae, swamp pop, hip-hop and rock.

The group headlines tonight's Nightfall Concert Series at Miller Plaza. Ridgefarm will open the show.

The band itself formed in 1989 in Switzerland. Hoffmann came to America in 1993 to see more of the world and became fascinated by New Orleans and

Hoffmann and his band of veteran musicians have recorded five albums, embarked on several European tours and played extensively in the United States.

The current B-Goes lineup has combined to play in more than 15 local and national bands, notably with the Continental Drifters, Steve Wynn and Anders Osborne.

Their live shows take on a tent revival atmosphere.

The B-Goes' newest CD, "Living in the Big Wide World," has been featured in several independent films as well as other artistic projects.

Andi Hoffmann & B-Goes have been compared to Bob Dylan, Rusted Root, Dave Matthews Band, Lou Reed, Daniel Lanois and the subdudes.
